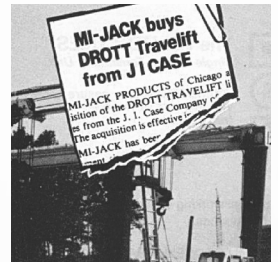
1970s
